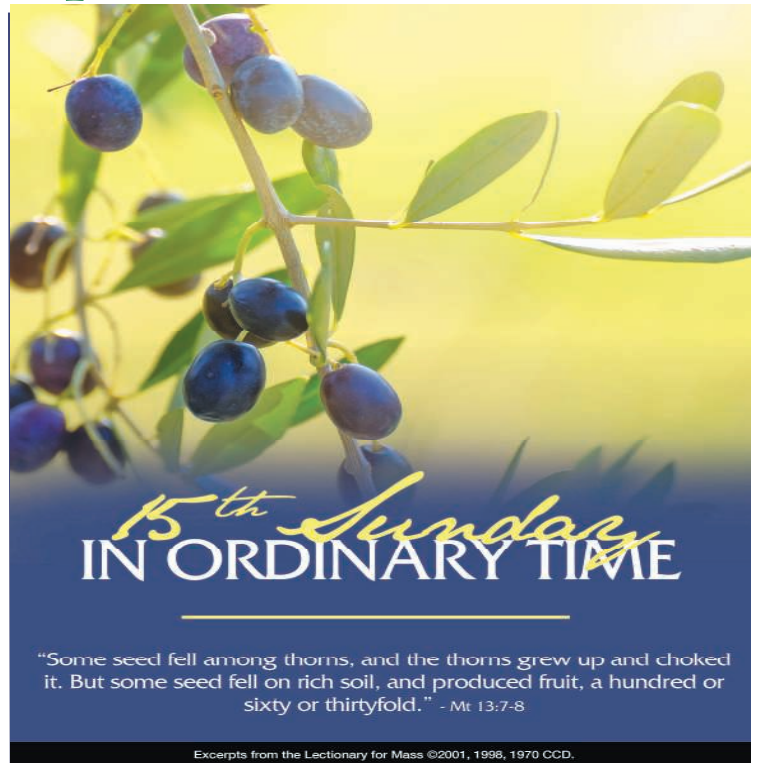

Liturgical Tidbits"

This past week I read an excellent article written by an Archbishop in the Philippines. He was exhorting his priests never to say "good morning" at Mass. At first, this may seem a little harsh, especially as many think it may be a good way for the priest to relate and for the whole experience of Mass to carry more relevance. But, consider the following points before we totally write off the cardinal's comments. First, there is already a greeting built into the liturgy and you know it well: "The Lord be with you." While we can hear "good morning" quite often, only in one place and in one context do we hear "The Lord be with you." This special greeting, like the rest of Mass is not merely a script that the priest recites, but a real greeting revealing the reason for the gathering taking place. This type of greeting we see used early in the Church as even St. Paul used something similar even in writing to the various churches. This leads to the next and most important point. What we do in liturgy is important, not because it is like other encounters or experiences, but instead it draws its relevance from the fact that it is something divine and otherworldly. The Mass and liturgy in general was not meant to be "business as usual" but worship which lifts our hearts to praise and seek God. So I have to agree with Cardinal Tagle, let's just celebrate the Mass and not add to it, after all, who can add to God?
